Administration Report: Kim Jonat

Having student body back all day every day – getting used to it. Going slowly forward with opening up activities. The Jazz Coffee House is an example of an event being thoughtfully created for safety. Trying to gradually open things up. Even the students have not done big events for a long time.

Today was a big day for our school. Leslie Jaremchuk, and Tannis Hendriks present for official opening of the new Argyle campus. Had a small guest list and live streamed the ceremony into the classrooms. There were some speakers, trustees, MLA Susie Chant, Mark Pearmain, Grade 12 Lucus Robson spoke in French – Student Council VP, President of Student Council spoke on behalf of student body. Unveiling of the 18 foot Welcome Figure in the front entrance that welcomes the community and provide protection to our students and our home. One Sacred Indigenous Song that will not be recorded.

Grad Photos are happening every day this week. Cap and Gowns and a relaxed pose. It is nice that the students can do this in our school. November 3 is an extra day this year. Due to COVID must space so needed an extra day.

1. AMA update– Diana Chan

Old Business

1. Teacher Wish List - Murray Bulger – DMA teacher speaking re: direct-to-garment printer Epson F2100 Cost: \$18,000

Looking for funding. Usually items are printed on regular printer and then transfer paper is used. This machine would be full-colour (unlimited colour choices) and high quality/high res. Can be printed on T-shirts, tote bags, hats, uniforms, aprons and even shoes. Prints cotton, blends and polyester. Requires no daily maintenance. Can do short runs at low prices, excellent profit margin, on-demand printing, environmentally friendly, simple to operate and quick printing. Could be used for Argyle projects: sports teams, grad wear, orange shirt day, Argyle swag, and Clubs. Local community could use it for LV Day, District events, non-profit fundraisers etc. Argyle DMA is located at school and has software and students to run this. Want to run this for Argyle community to just recover costs, could make small profit from local community projects. Cost is approx. \$7/shirt with this printer at Argyle vs \$29.69/shirt from local printer. Argyle would provide art/design, printing and shirts. T-shirts would cost approx: \$3-4 with ink costing about \$2. About 1100 shirts per year over 4 years would cover cost of printer in case of replacement needed. Argyle Pipers football is willing to pitch in \$2000 as they want to use it. DMA requesting \$6000 from PAC this year and \$6000 next year. DMA students and Murray Bulger would run these projects. Printer would be in room 134, T-shirts housed in flex space. All money matters associated with sales would run though School Cash Online as much as possible. Our goal was to provide \$6000x3 years but that appears unnecessary now. MOTION: The PAC approve \$6000 toward the printer -Leslie Jaremchuk. Second Mark Howard. **Motion Carried**. If they come back in the Spring with a further indication of need, will vote again then.

2. Leanne Woodward and Football helmet request - did anything come through the dept as a formal request? Helmet request from last meeting – nothing to update and will not be on the agenda for next time as the request needs to go through the proper channels. There has also been a Bottle Drive account set up down at Brooksbank Bottle depot. The Argyle School number is the account number and they will print a label for your bag of bottles, the count will go to Argyle football.

New Business

- 1. When we are able to do something in person at the school while we are not fundraising for a big event. Wine and Cheese Parent School Tour is Leslie's current idea. We have to be fairly quick, so when Kim says we can do this we are ready to proceed very quickly. Wants to develop a plan quite quickly so that we get them to pay some money, fun, wine and cheese before they get into the school themselves. Moving Tours through the school. - 2. Any other new business Kim has a map on her screen that she screen shared with us about the Security camera locations/positions and angles of view. None of the views are into a classroom, bathroom or change room. Coverage around the gym. This will be more important when the community entrance is open.
